Intercession 2

Let me begin by providing an update on the Busia outcome where evil was turned into good. You will recall that a bishop, Washington Omollo, had been at the core of afflicting the Bride, resulting in the death and the beating of Bride brothers. So, Constable Peter, a Bride brother, traveled there to meet with him and bring light and truth. And as noted in the preceding report, he and others there confessed their wrong and accepted Bride truth. They called me at that time and Washington and several others made their confessions as Bride and asked forgiveness for their previous behavior. Of course we were most glad to receive them. Peter then returned to Rongo.

But a most surprising thing then happened. Washington was on his property and suddenly collapsed and died. He was fifty-seven. This was quite disturbing, but I talked with his wife and she was most glad that he was Bride and not a Christian. To honor him, Caleb, Peter, and another Bride brother traveled there for his burial, and while there some of them recorded videos of their confessions, which you can watch here.

You may now ask: Why did Washington collapse and die upon conversion to the Bride? To answer this, let me go back to 2010 when something occurred that shook me.

The first black person/man to confess the Bride was Stanley Batton around 2002. We had a nickname for him and that was "Mr. Faithful." If we called a Bride gathering, even at the drop of a hat, Stanley would always be there. When we held all things in common in 2003, Stanley drove from New York to Washington State to be a part of it. There was no one more faithful than Stanley. But we were rattled when on September 11, 2010 (the ninth anniversary of the fall of the Twin Towers), Stanley suddenly died. That was not supposed to happen. The Bride is to ascend alive and not die. And in fact, no one else had died until Africa. And there have been a host of deaths from there, the most recent being Washington. So why all of these deaths of black men and even women? I cannot answer that, but regarding Washington, there is indeed a specific testimony.

Washington obviously bears the name of the first President of the United States of America: George Washington. And as we know, "America" means "kingdom of heaven." "Amel" is Old Gothic for "heaven." "Ric" means "kingdom," as in Germany's Third Reich. These are evidenced in the German word, Himmelreich, which equally means "kingdom of heaven." And the "a" makes it feminine. Therefore, the name "Washington" would attest to the beginning of the church, which of course lies with the first Remnant.

And we know that the first Remnant was a Leviticus 14 "first bird" sacrifice so that the "second bird" second Remnant could ascend alive. But even so, these brothers are indeed Bride, including our black brother, Stanley, and I trust that all of them at the

sound of the trumpet will resurrect from the dead with the first Remnant and ascend alive. And as well, I most certainly hope that the sacrifice of the Bride black man in Africa is at a much-needed end! They have all indeed paid a great price, as it is written: "And they overcame him because of the blood of the Lamb and because of the word of their testimony, and they did not love their life even when faced with death" (Revelation 12:11). In so doing this, they certainly unite us with the first Remnant. And as black men, they cry out that the curse on the black man of Africa would all the more cease (Zechariah 3:9)!

And let me say one more thing about our dear brother, Stanley. I said that we called him "Mr. Faithful." Of course that was very true. But I have to ask: Did the Father provide Stanley as a foreshadowing testimony of the oh-so-faithful black man of Africa, who throughout all of mankind have been the ones who have responded to Bride truth so freely and faithfully? That is indeed Yahweh's way—to foreshadow that which is to be. We see this throughout the Bible. And it is evident that this is exactly why the Father gave us Stanley and his testimony of true faithfulness, and that he and all of the black men and women of Africa who have died in the Bride will be in the first resurrection. So the next time I see Stanley will be in the heavenlies, where we will be transformed into the immortal.

And let me provide one other thing while I am here. Caleb sent me a <u>portion of a video</u> so as to show me Dr. Gupta Jadhav. This is the doctor who treated Caleb for his river blindness, and as a result of that contact and reading at the Remnant Bride site became a Bride brother. And quite possibly, if we receive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the latter rain, for several reasons I anticipate that the next country I will go to is India.

And as always, brothers and sisters, I invite you to give to this work so that these outcomes can be accomplished. And more immediately: amazingly, we have been approved by the Kenyan health officials to have three meetings/teaching sessions of up to six hundred people each, all in Mombasa. At this point I plan to return there in the latter part of September. We still have to check into some other things like flight availability and such, but are looking to the Father to lead and provide.
